If planning to go to a college or university within CA review the IGETC requirements.	Remember a community college (2 year college) is cheaper than a 4 year college.		
This form shows exactly the bare minimum classes you need in order to be accepted to the college or university.	Unless you have a scholarship, you should take your lower division requirements (1st 2 years of college courses) at a community college first before transferring to a 4 year college.



SPORTS What are your odds of becoming a professional athlete? According to Sports Report (Please be aware that these statistics were accurate at the time this flyer was created and may have changed since then.)



There are 1,083,617 in high school football. 72,788 are chosen to play in college. 256 are drafted to the pros and only 1 out of 4,233 are picked to play pro.



There are 486,567 in high school baseball. 34,198 are chosen to play in college. 738 are drafted to the pros and only 1 out of 659 are picked to play pro.



There are 541,479 in men's high school basketball. 18,697 are chosen to play in college. 46 are drafted to the pros and only 1 out of 11,771 are actually picked to play pro.



There are 429,504 in women's high school basketball. 16,589 are chosen to play in college. 33 are drafted to the pros and only 1 out of 13,015 are actually picked to play pro.

Knowing this where does that lead you? Plan B. This goes back to investing in yourself so you can invest in your future. What can you do now to make sure that 10-20 years from now your worth will be more valuable?
